**ANT 100 Introduction to Anthropology** (3 hours) – Introduction to the study of man from an anthropological perspective.  
**ANT 102 Introduction to Cultural Anthropology** (3 hours) – Introduction to the study of contemporary cultures & societies.  
**ANT 100 & ANT 102 do not have to be taken in order**

**ARH 252 Survey of Art I** (3 hours) – Art from the prehistoric through the medieval periods.  
**ARH 253 Survey of Art II** (3 hours) – Art from the Renaissance through the modern periods.  
**ARH 252 & ARH 253 do not have to be taken in order**

**AY 101 & 102 Introduction to Astronomy & Lab** (4 hours)  
**AY course & lab must both be taken to satisfy part of the Natural Science requirement.**

**BSC 108 Introductory Biology for Non-Majors** (4 hours) – Survey of the basic principles of cellular biology.  
**BSC 109 Introductory Biology for Non-Majors** (4 hours) - Study of the physiology of living organisms.  
**BSC 108 and BSC 109 do not have to be taken in order**

**CH 101 Introductory Chemistry** (4 hours) – for Engineering students  
**CH 104 Introductory Chemistry** (4 hours) – for Nursing & HES students

**COM 122 Critical Decision Making** (3 hours)  
**COM 123 Public Speaking** (3 hours)  
**COM 122 & COM 123 do not have to be taken in order**

**CS 102 Microcomputer Applications** (3 hours) – Familiarization with Windows  
**CS 202 Information Highway** (3 hours)  
**CS 205 Website Design** (3 hours) (CS 202 is the prerequisite)  
**CS 285 Microcomputer Applications** (3 hours)  
**CS102 is a prerequisite for all CS courses**

**EN 101 English Composition I** (3 hours) & **EN 102 English Composition II** (3 hours)  
**EN 101 & EN 102 must be completed in order and are the prerequisites for all EN courses**  
**EN 209 American Literature I** (3 hours) – Survey of American literature from its beginnings to 1865.  
**EN 210 American Literature II** (3 hours) – Survey of American literature from 1865 to the present.  
**EN 209 & EN 210 do not have to be taken in order**

**GY 105 World Regional Geography** (3 hours)  
**GY 110 Principles of Human Geography** (3 hours)  
**GY 105 & GY 110 do not have to be taken in order**

**HD 101 Human Development** (3 hours) – An introduction to the basic principles of physical, cognitive, and psychosocial development across the lifespan.

**HY 101 Western Civilization to 1648** (3 hours) & **HY 102 Western Civilization from since 1648** (3 hours)  
**HY 203 American Civilization to 1865** (3 hours) & **HY 204 American Civilization since 1865** (3 hours)  
**HY courses do not have to be taken in order**

**JA 101 and JA 102 Elementary Japanese** (4 hours)  
**JA 101 & JA 102 must be taken in order**

**JN 200 Introduction to Journalism** (3 hours)

**MATH 110 Finite Math** (3 hours)  
***Prerequisites: Placement and two units of college-preparatory mathematics;***  
**MATH 112 Pre-calculus Algebra** (3 hours)  
***Prerequisites: Placement and three units of college-preparatory mathematics***  
**MATH 121 Calculus & It's Application** (3 hours)  
***Prerequisite: MATH 112 or equivalent.***

**PHL 100 Introduction to Philosophy** (3 hours)  
**PHL 204 Medical Ethics** (3 hours)  
**PHL 100 & PHL 204 do not have to be taken in order**
